

# You Break It, You Buy It

Kids were in a museum. Parents were taking selfies, talking on their cell phones, chatting with friends, or generally not paying attention - choose your favorite irresponsible pose. Expensive art pieces were broken. The museum, or artist, sent the kids' parents bills for the damages. The parents were shocked, angry and surprised at the amount of the bill. Debates started in the online comments about the parents' lack of supervision, the brattiness of their kids, the amount of money involved, and the value of the art. Tempers flared. Recriminations, blame and name-calling ensued. But, bottom line, most folks commenting went with the principle, "You break it; you buy it!"

Most of us are supposed to know that art in a museum is not something we should touch, handle or grab unless we  $|J_{esus}|$  lived a different set of are directed to do just that. The value of but most folks know you don't touch art unless asked. In fact, most parents are museum with their kids. vou don't handle the merchandise unless you want to kids: "You break it; you buy it!"

any one piece of art might be disputed, values: "You break me, I buy you. You beat me, I heal you. well aware that if they go into a store or You bruise me, I take care of your sin." Rather than get a pay for it. The principle holds, even with bill for Jesus' being damaged, we were redeemed!

Thankfully, God didn't follow this principle when he chose to reveal himself to us in Jesus.

First, God didn't show up and put himself on display in a protected place like a museum. Instead, he allowed himself to be born to poor folks from a despised city who were visiting where no one would take them in as a family. Instead, God came to our world as a baby, born in a stable with a feed trough for his bed.

Second, when God came to us in Jesus of Nazareth, he touched all sorts of people those who were blind, lame, beggars, paralyzed, old, young, men, women, sick, dead, and healthy. He also allowed himself to be touched by all sorts of people - so many, in fact, it was hard to tell who actually touched him in the big crowds that flocked to see and hear him. Jesus allowed himself to be loved, admired, cuddled, abused and beaten. Jesus was God made touchable. So much so, that Matthew called him "Immanuel." which means "God with us" (Matthew 1:23).

Third, when he was broken, he blessed. Rather than the principle, "You break it, you buy it!" Jesus lived a different set of values: "You break me, I buy you. You beat me, I heal you. You bruise me, I take care of your sin." Rather than getting a bill for Jesus' Continued on Inside being damaged, we were redeemed!
