

AVOIDING AN EVANGELISM CRISIS IN THE USA

Concern is mounting among mission workers about the crisis in evangelism in the USA. As we are busy doing mission work and raising funds, we continually pray for churches and Christians in the USA to remain strong in their faith. But too often we see tell-tale signs of a predicament emerging - one that is weakening churches and affecting mission work adversely.

Sadly, there is a problem becoming a catastrophe in too many of our churches in America because too many have neglected evangelism for a long period of time. At home and in India, we have taught that the work of the church is evangelism, edification and benevolence. These are basic - so what has happened to evangel-

Consider this: If a congregation stopped crease, and finally ceases helping the needy and responding to sickness and deaths in the community, the evangelism, it begins to die. townsfolk would say, "Those people in the church of Christ don't care about others."

Brothers and sisters, we would never be guilty of neglecting the needy, failing to send food to homes of grieving families, not *later*. visiting the sick, not checking on those in

nursing homes, nor neglecting the shut-ins in our community - whether they are members of the Lord's church or not. It is who we are as Christians, and these things must be done in the spirit of Christ.

What if the community saw that we were not having Bible classes and worship on Sunday mornings? They would think the church had closed up. There may not be many cars in the parking lot, but as long as there are a few, the community knows the church still exists. Worship is the last activity we would stop.

If a congregation loses interest in evangelism, and it stops trying to win souls, gradually - without even noticing it - that church will shrink in membership.

The elderly pass away, some fall away, while other move away, and if these are not replaced with new members, the church shrinks. Suddenly, one day the congregation wakes up to realize their attendance and contributions are down, and they are in real trouble.

Once a church begins to decrease and finally ceases evangelism, it begins to die. We would not stop our benevolence or our worship services, but when we stop being evangelistic, we will not realize the danger until years later - and then it will be too late! Continued on inside
