

Thirteen Reasons to Do Something Nice for Somebody Today (Ten weren't enough)

13. Be nice just because you can (Galatians 6:10). Every opportunity to be nice is a gift from God.

12. Being nice to others follows the good example of some notably good people (Abram in Genesis 13: 8-9, David in 2 Samuel 9:1-13, Dorcas in Acts 9:36-43 to name a few)

11. Being nice to others combats pride and arrogance (Proverbs 3:34 and 16:5). Seeking to bless others keeps us from focusing too much on ourselves (Philippians 2:4).

10. Good people always appreciate you for being nice to them (1 Thessalonians 5:17). Gratitude is built into their souls.

9. Believers - and sometimes even others - know that everything good flows from God, and they'll glorify Him because of your niceness (Matthew 5:16, James 1:17).

8. Few things feel as nice as being nice (Philippians 4:4-9). Niceness pulls us upward.

7. Practice (good, sound, correct practice), makes perfect (1 Thessalonians 4: 9-10). The more we're nice, the more we'll know how to be nice.

6. It often costs nothing - except kindness and attention - to be nice (Proverbs 11: 24-26). Niceness need not break the bank or even strain the budget.

5. Most people reciprocate - be nice to them and they'll be nice to you (2 Chronicles 9: 5-12, 1 Samuel 25: 18-42). Niceness can set in motion a cycle

of blessing and encouragement.

4. God rewards niceness and every other loving behavior (Genesis 24: 10-60, Colossians 3: 23-24).

3. Today is all we have (James 4: 13-17). There's absolutely no guarantee of tomorrow. Even if you have a tomorrow, the people you plan to be nice to may not.

2. Showing love draws us closer to God (1John 4:7-8).

1. As nice as it is to be nice, "nice" doesn't even begin to cover how good God is to us (1 John 4: 9-10 and 19, Romans 5: 6-11). Bill Bagents, Mars Hill Messenger Treat everyone with kindness and respect, even those who are rude to you – not because they are nice, but because you are.

LOOK WHAT YOU DID TO ME!

The story is told of a very angry fellow who unleashed a haymaker toward his neighbor. The neighbor ducked, the angry man hit the wall, and he fractured his hand. As soon as the pain allowed him to speak, he yelled at his neighbor, "Look what you did to me!'

We see the inaccuracy, the false attribution. It's not "what you did to me." Rather, it's what you did to you. We often struggle to take responsibility for our actions and their results. Examples abound:

*the student who yells at his teacher, "I can't believe you failed me!" * the speeder who yells at the officer, "I can't believe you hid behind that sign with your radar gun!" * the gossip who yells at his friend, "I can't believe you repeated what I told you in confidence!"* the employee who yells at her boss, "I can't believe you fired me just for being late!"* even worse, the abusive husband who yells at his wife, "I can't believe you made me hit you - again!"

There are biblical examples of this sad tendency to deny and displace responsibility:

*Adam tried it with, "The woman whom You gave to be with me, she gave me of the tree, and I ate" (Genesis 3:12) * Aaron tried it with, "You know the people, that they are set on evil " (Exodus 32:22) * Saul tried it with, "When I saw the people were scattered from me, and that you did not come within the days appointed..." (1 Samuel 13:11) * Saul tried again with, "I have sinned ... because I feared the people and obeyed their voice" (1 Samuel 15"24) * The one-talent man tried with, "Lord, I knew you to be a hard man, reaping where you have not sown, and gathering where you have not scattered" (Matthew 25:24).

People keep trying to dodge, deny and displace spiritual responsibility. It hasn't worked yet - not even once. Such efforts impede repentance which, in turn, impedes both forgiveness and restoration. And while doing so, those futile efforts both insult God and make us look really bad. Via Mars Hill Messenger
