

BALANCE AND GOOD JUDGMENT

The early bird gets the worm, but the second mouse gets the cheese.

Better thirty minutes early than five minutes late, provided we belong there at all.

If I had done what I "coulda" when I "shoulda," I'd be a happy man right now.

The operation was a success, but the patient died. You will still get a bill in the mail.

What I should have said right then came to me at midnight, about three days too late.

Perhaps God would give us more insight if we did a better job of respecting what He has said.

What I hoped was my last nerve, wasn't. Things can almost always get worse or better.

I can hear what you want to say loud and clear. Can I find the courage to listen?

Yes, the Lord delivered him. It was like he fell out of a well.

A fellow asked a farmer, "What would you do if you had a million dollars?" The farmer's reply: "I guess I'd keep farming until it was all gone." Realism can be both funny and no fun.

I'm impressed with "the sons of Issachar who had understanding of the times, to know what Israel ought to do..." (1 Chronicles 12:32). Some are gifted with such insight. I wish I were better at identifying such people. I wish I were better about heeding the counsel of such people. Some just think they understand the times; their confidence is impressive. So is their amnesia. They never seem to acknowledge their errors, and they depend on our accompanying amnesia.

Sometimes the times are easy to understand, but that doesn't mean that we do. Matthew 16: 1-4 is stunning. Jesus chided the critical Pharisees: "Hypocrites! You know how to discern the face of the sky, but you cannot discern the signs of the times." They could look skyward and do their own weather predictions, but they ignored God's warnings and instruction. They ignored God's signs while demanding that God give them a sign. Stunningly ironic and stunningly sad!

God's word tells us what we need to know. As needed, God pulls back the curtain to show us His heart and the blessings of trusting Him. But He certainly doesn't tell us everything that we think we want to know. We love Jesus' response to apostles' question in Acts 1:7: "It is not for you to know the times of the seasons which the Father has put in His own authority." Trust Him.
