

TRUE LIGHT

JESUS AND PETER

"Into every life some rain must fall." There will be disappointments and sorrows in each of our lives. People will not live up to our expectations, even when those expectations are both realistic and reachable.

Peter repeatedly disappointed Jesus after Jesus called him from mending fishing nets to fishing for men. Peter requested he be allowed to walk on the water to Jesus, and then Peter disappointed Jesus when he took his eyes off Him (Matthew 14: 26-31). Peter disappointed Jesus when Peter rebuked Him for stating that He must be killed. Matthew 16:23 says, But He turned and said to Peter, 'Get behind Me, Satan! You are an offense to Me, for you are not mindful of the things of God, but the things of men.' Peter disappointed Jesus on the mount at the Transfiguration when Peter had to be rebuked again for his words

(Matthew 17: 1-9). Peter disappointed Jesus when, die with Jesus and never be offended at Him. Peter denied the Lord three times

Jesus continued to give strength, courage, after saying that he would comfort and love to Peter even though Peter had sorely disappointed Him on many occasions.

the very same night (Matthew 26: 69-75). The denials came on the heels of having disappointed Jesus by cutting off the ear of a servant of the high priest. Peter continued to believe that Jesus' kingdom would be an earthly one after the years spent with Jesus, during which Jesus never taught nor promised an earthly kingdom. Even after Jesus' resurrection, Peter continued to disappoint Him by wanting to know about the other disciples instead of being concerned only about "feeding my sheep" (John 21: 17-22). Jesus knew that Paul would have to rebuke Peter at Antioch after Peter once again would disappoint the Lord by separating himself from the Gentiles (Galatians 2: 11-21).

However, never once did Jesus' attitude and relationship change towards Peter. Peter was still given and allowed to keep the keys of the kingdom of heaven. Peter still preached the first gospel sermon on the day of Pentecost where 3,000 souls were saved. Peter was still allowed to pen at least two books of the New Testament which will be preserved till the Lord's return. Jesus continued to give strength, courage, comfort and love to Peter even though Peter had sorely disappointed Him on many occasions. Jesus loved Peter enough to hang on the cross for him mere hours after Peter and the other apostles had fled, denied, and disappointed Him.
