Likewise, those same baseball fans know immediately who is being discussed when somebody says "The Man." Stan "The Man" Musial was my first sports hero. I can't see any possibility of anybody ever taking his place in my mind.

Recently I watched a clip of an interview with Bob Costas. He was discussing an evening during which he, Mickey Mantle, and Stan Musial were together at Mr. Costas' house.

Bob Costas had invited Mickey Mantle to St. Louis for some sort of charity event. He and his wife invited Mantle over to their house for dinner. They had also decided to invite Stan Musial and his wife.



After the meal and after the Musials had left, Bob Costas and Mickey Mantle stayed up past midnight talk-

ing. In the interview I watched, Costas related something from that conversation that I found interesting.

While I don't have the exact words that were said, the gist of the comments is that Mantle told Costas that nobody could hit a ball as hard as he could during his career and, until he got hurt, nobody could run as fast. However, in his estimation, Stan Musial was a better player than he was because he was a better man than he was. "The Mick" said that "The Man" made the best use of what he saw as God-given talents. CELEBRATION IN HIS PRESENCE

Many years ago, 100 high-pressured deodorant guns were installed at a large city dump, one of several hundred smelly landfill sites that had become the focus of growing public concern. To saturate the mounds of putrefying garbage, the cannons sprayed several gallons of fragrance per minute at a distance of more than 160 feet. But no matter how much deodorant was sprayed, the fragrance couldn't completely mask the problem.

Similar to the use of deodorant guns, King David attempted to mask the odor of his sin. After his adultery with Bathsheba and complicity in the murder of her husband (2 Samuel 11:1-17), David used the "deodorant" of silence, deceit, and outward piety to cover up his actions. But unable to withstand the guilt of his sin and the sting of God's conviction, David eventually cried out to Him for mercy and spiritual cleansing. He prayed, *Have mercy on me, O God ... Against you, you only, have I sinned* (Psalm 51:1, 4).

David uncovered his sins before God, and acknowledged, confessed, and repented of them (32:5). God forgave the king's disobedience and restored his joy (vv 5, 7; 51:12-15). David, like a shaken bottle of carbonated water, burst forth with praise to teach others about God's forgiveness. Celebration followed the king's confession and repentance.

When we sin, it's futile to try and cover it up. The odor of our disobedience can't be contained. But when we confess our sin and repent of it, He'll remove it and leave the fragrance of His grace and forgiveness. He'll restore the joy of our salvation, allowing us to once again celebrate in His presence. Marvin Williams
