SHARING OUR LIGHT

I recently returned from a trip to Uganda where I was blessed to meet with men and women that serve as beacons of light set on a hill. In a country that has so little, I witnessed these brothers and sisters in Christ exhibit a faith in Jesus and a love for their fellow Ugandan's which included meeting present needs and an urgency to share the hope and answers to an eternal need.

God is described as light in 1 John 1:5, and Jesus is described as the true light in John 1:9 and 1 John 2:8. Jesus proclaims that he is the light of the world in John 9:5.

In Matthew 5, we are called to be the light of the world by reflecting Jesus through a life of obedience and love. Matthew 5:14 states:

You are the light of the world. A town built on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead, they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your Father in heaven.

As children of God, Jesus is reminding us that we are indeed His ambassadors, giving evidence of where our heart is and who we follow and trust.

One Sunday, while in Uganda, we traveled all day to reach a group so we could worship together. On our way we reached a bridge which had been washed out. The only way to reach the gathering was to take a mountain pass, which was not a road. To say it was not a wise decision would be an understatement, yet with much prayer and serious help from people on the way we made it five hours late.

When we finally arrived, the reception was overwhelming and a blessing I will never forget. Those waiting on us did so without bathrooms, electricity or running water. Worshiping together and partaking of communion was a beautiful and uplifting experience because there was *light* shining brightly. We were worshiping under trees in a small community of thatch huts. I have no idea where the hundreds of people came from, as the only vehicle present was the one we came in. I asked one of the leaders where he lived and how he got there. He pointed to a mountain in the distance and said he walked from the other side of the mountain, 12 kilometers away. Because we were five hours late, he would have to make his walk home in the dark.

I John 1:7 tells us, If we walk in the light, as He is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus, His Son, purifies us from all sin. In Uganda it also produces a reality that includes sacrifice, unselfishness, love and obedience in a double measure, which was evidenced over and over by the brothers and sisters. It also produced a joy and brotherhood that was evidenced at every stop and with every interaction. To God be the glory!

I AM HIS HANDS

Jia Haixia lost his sight in the year 2000. His friend Jia Wenqi lost his arms as a child. But they've found a way around their disabilities. "I am his hands and he is my eyes," Haixia says. Together, they're transforming their village in China.

Since 2002 the friends have been on a mission to regenerate a wasteland near their home. Each day Haixia climbs on Wenqi's back to cross a river to the site. Wenqi then "hands" Haixi a shovel with his foot, before Haixia places a pail on a pole between Wenqi's cheek and shoulder. And as one digs and the other waters, the two plant trees - more than 10,000 so far. "Working together, we don't feel disabled at all," Haixia says. "We're a team."

The apostle Paul likens the church to a body, each part needing the other to function. If the church were all eyes, there'd be no hearing; if all ears, there'd be no sense of smell (1 Corinthians 12: 14-17). *The eye cannot say to the hand, "I don't need you!"* Paul says (v 21). Each of us plays a role in the church based on our spiritual gifts (vv 7-11, 18). Like Jia Haixia and Jia Wenqi, when we combine our strengths, we can bring change to the world.
